Human Rights, Civil Rights - It's All the Right Thing to Do!



Which novels about civil and human rights would you recommend? It could be on women's rights, children's rights, decolonisation, freedom of expression, dystopia, reconciliation after conflict... As long as the theme is the basic rights of people.

The answer might come right away, or perhaps you have to think about it. Your mind might go blank for a moment, or maybe you already have not one but two, three or even ten books. Whatever the case, here are two of our recommendations.

'The Grapes of Wrath' by John Steinbeck - a novel about the exploitation of seasonal workers in California during the Great Depression in the 1940s. This novel highlights the exploitation of workers in precarious situations, at the mercy of their employers. The circumstances found in 'The Grapes of Wrath' are unfortunately the same working conditions faced by many migrants and seasonal workers today.

March: Book One (available in our collection, J 323 L5873m) is the first book in a graphic novel trilogy by Congressman John Lewis, co-author Andrew Aydin, and illustrator Nate Powell, chronicling Lewis's life and the American Civil Rights Movement through his firsthand account, from his youth in Alabama to the Nashville sit-ins. It's a National Book Award winner that details the struggle against segregation and the philosophy of nonviolence, making it a significant work in comics and civil rights history.
